

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS Psychosocial Team Coordinator

JRS Malta is seeking to recruit a PSYCHOSOCIAL TEAM COORDINATOR to work with forced migrants and asylum seekers.

Terms and conditions

The post is a full-time post, however applications from individuals wishing to work part-time or reduced hours will also be considered. Individuals who cannot work at least 25-30 hours per week, of which at least 20 hours are on weekdays between 09:00 and 17:00, need not apply.

The selected candidate will be offered a one-year definite contract, with the possibility of being offered an indefinite contract upon successful performance review.

Qualifications

Applicants must:

- → Hold a recognized degree in Social Work, Psychotherapy, Counselling, Applied Psychology or any other degree related to a caring profession at MQF Level 6 (subject to a minimum of 180 ECTS/ECVET credits);¹
- → Have a minimum of three years' work experience;
- → Have an excellent command of written and spoken English;
- → Possess extensive organizational and communication skills;
- → Be able to work independently and on their own initiative within a fast-paced environment;
- → Be willing to work with and for people from diverse cultures.

The following will be considered an asset:

- Previous experience working with migrants, asylum seekers and other vulnerable groups;
- Previous experience in a similar management/coordinating role;
- Working knowledge of Maltese;
- Working knowledge of other relevant languages like French or Arabic;
- Knowledge of law, policy and practice relating to migration and asylum;

- A valid driving license and own transport.

Qualifications and experience claimed must be supported by certificated and/or testimonials.

Job description

The selected candidate will be expected to work as part of a multidisciplinary team and manage a Psychosocial Team made up of professionals offering social work, medical, psychological and education/youth support.

The Psychosocial Team Coordinator will:

- → Guide and coordinate the work of the psychosocial team members in the respective fulfilment of their roles,
- → Ensure that the Psychosocial Team members are supported in carrying out their duties;
- → Plan and hold regular Psychosocial Team meetings to offer a dedicated space for joint and complex cases to be discussed in a more structured and holistic way;
- → Be the case manager for clients with multiple and complex needs;
- → Be the main point of reference for crisis clients and unexpected psychosocial emergencies;
- → Administer the Hardship Fund;
- → Coordinate the intake of clients requiring psychosocial support;
- → Coordinate professional supervision;
- → Contribute to research and advocacy efforts;
- → Support in the identification and provision of training needs for members of the Psychosocial Team;
- → Assist with any other tasks that may be required.

Application and selection process

Applicants are to submit a letter of application, a police conduct certificate issued by the Criminal Records Office or other competent authority not earlier than one (1) month from the date of application and a detailed Curriculum Vitae, together with the names and contact details of two referees by not later than **Monday 14**th **July 2025** to Mark Cachia, the JRS Operations Manager on mark@jrsmalta.org or by post to:
