### Community Support Worker

JRS Malta is seeking to recruit a part time **community support worker** to work with forced migrants and asylum seekers.

#### **Terms and conditions**

The selected candidates will be required to work flexible working hours and be offered a one- year definite contract, with the possibility of renewal upon successful performance review.

Prospective candidates who can offer less than 8 hours per week need not apply.

JRS Malta will pay the employee the full-time equivalent of €21,500 per annum.

#### **Qualifications**

Applicants must:

- Hold a recognised certificate (MQF Level 5, preferably in the fields of Social Care and/or Humanities) or relevant experience;
- Have an excellent command of written and spoken English;
- Possess extensive organisational and communication skills;
- Be able to work independently and on their own initiative within a fast-paced environment;
- Be willing to work with and for people from diverse cultures.

The following will be considered an asset:

- Previous experience working with migrants, asylum seekers and other vulnerable groups;
- Working knowledge of Maltese;
- Working knowledge of other relevant languages like French or Arabic;
- Knowledge of law, policy and practice relating to migration and asylum;
- A valid driving license and own transport.

#### **Job descriptions**

The selected candidate/s will be expected to work as part of a multidisciplinary team.

The community support worker will work with other members of JRS staff to:

- Assist in the implementation of life skills programmes tailored to the needs of particularly vulnerable asylum seekers;
- Work with individuals and groups to promote life-skills and foster independence and self-sufficiency;
- Support individuals requiring additional follow-up/assistance, when requested to do so;
- Follow up on individuals requiring multiple services to ensure that they receive the support

- they need in a coordinated manner;
- Promote integration of vulnerable asylum seekers by assisting in developing communities of support and organising recreational, social, and community-building activities;
  - Participate in community outreach and assist in community-building activities which strengthen migrant communities;
  - Assist with any other tasks that may be required.

### **Application and selection process**

Applicants are to submit:

- A letter of application;
- A police conduct certificate issued by the Criminal Records Office or other competent authority not earlier than three (3) months from the date of application;
- A detailed Curriculum Vitae;
- A copy of Qualifications;
- MQRIC recognition (if applicable); and
- Warrant together with the names and contact details of two referees
