

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

Social Worker

JRS Malta is seeking to recruit a **SOCIAL WORKER** to work with forced migrants and asylum seekers.

Terms and conditions

The post is a full-time post, however applications from individuals wishing to work part-time or reduced hours will also be considered. Individuals who cannot work at least 16-20 hours per week, of which at least 10 hours are on weekdays between 09:00 and 17:00, need not apply.

The selected candidate will be offered a one-year definite contract, with the possibility of being offered an indefinite contract upon successful performance review.

Salary range: €25,200.00 - €28,800.00 per annum for full-time position, based on the candidate's experience. The salary for a part-time position will be calculated pro-rata.

Qualifications

Applicants must:

- Hold a recognised degree in Social Work;
- Have an excellent command of written and spoken English;
- Possess extensive organisational and communication skills;
- Be able to work independently and on their own initiative within a fast-paced environment;
- Be willing to work with and for people from diverse cultures.

The following will be considered an asset:

- Possession of a Social Work Warrant as regulated by the Social Work Profession Act;
- Previous experience working with migrants, asylum seekers and other vulnerable groups;
- Working knowledge of Maltese;
- Working knowledge of other relevant languages like French, Spanish or Arabic;
- Knowledge of law, policy and practice relating to migration and asylum;
- A valid driving license and own transport.

Job description

The selected candidate will be expected to work as part of a multidisciplinary team.

The Social Worker will:

- Develop and implement a care plan for in-depth clients with a particular focus on vulnerable clients and young asylum seekers and refugees;
- Meet with individual clients and/or families to assess their needs and goals, referring to external agencies and service providers relevant to clients' needs;
- Take a lead role in providing support to clients facing hardship and housing difficulties;
- Liaise with other caring professionals within the JRS team to provide a holistic psychosocial service to clients;
- Conduct outreach activities in open centres and other locations together with other team members;
- Assist in the implementation of JRS' drop-in service;
- Assist with any other tasks that may be required.

Application and selection process

Applicants are to submit a letter of application, a recent police conduct certificate and a detailed Curriculum Vitae, together with the names and contact details of two referees by not later than **Monday 17th August 2026** to Jessica Mamo (JRS Operations Manager) on jessica@jrsmalta.org.

Candidates will be required to attend an interview and may be asked to undertake one or more task/s before a final decision is taken.
